**9.05.010 Title.**

This chapter may be cited as the Lyons Criminal Ordinance. [Ord. T6-18 § 1, 1990.]

**9.05.020 Adoption of state statutes.**

All statutes regarding misdemeanors and violations, whether classified or unclassified, as defined by the Oregon Revised Statutes, are hereby adopted in their entirety. Any violation, act or omission which, if committed, would be a misdemeanor or violation under the Oregon Revised Statutes, is hereby declared to be a violation of this chapter and shall be an offense against this city, subject to the procedures and penalties provided in the Oregon Revised Statutes for each particular offense. **9.05.030 Construction and interpretation.**

This chapter shall be interpreted and construed in conformity with state laws and court decisions governing the statutes, misdemeanors and violations hereby adopted. [Ord. T6-18 § 3, 1990.]

#### **9.15.010 Curfew imposed.**

No minor under 18 years of age shall be on the street, highway, park, alley or other public place between the hours specified in LMC 9.15.020, unless the minor is accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person 21 years of age or over and authorized by the parent or guardian or by law to have custody of the minor, or unless the minor is engaged in a lawful pursuit or activity which requires the minor's presence upon the street, highway, park, alley or other public place, or unless the minor is emancipated pursuant to ORS Chapter 419B. [Ord. G1-2006 § 17, 2006; Ord. T6-11 § 1, 1985.]

#### **9.15.020 Curfew hours.**

For the purposes of this chapter, the applicable hours of curfew are the hours between 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., winter hours, Labor Day through Memorial Day; 11:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m., summer hours, Memorial Day to Labor Day. [Ord. T6-11 § 2, 1985.]

#### **9.15.030 Parental responsibility.**

No parent, guardian, or other person having the legal custody of a minor person under the age of 18 years shall permit the minor to be in violation of this chapter. [Ord. T6-11 § 3, 1985.]

#### **9.15.040 Police custody.**

Any minor who violates any provision of this chapter may be taken into temporary custody by a peace officer in accordance with ORS Chapter 419C. The officer, subject to the limitations set forth in ORS 419C, may detain any minor taken into temporary custody at the police station for a reasonable period of time. As soon as practicable after the minor is taken into custody, the officer shall notify the minor's parents, guardian or other

person responsible for the minor, and shall release the minor to such person at the police station. [Ord. G1-2006 § 17, 2006; Ord. T6-11 § 4, 1985.]

#### **9.15.050 Penalty.**

Violation of LMC 9.15.030 by a parent, guardian or other person having the legal custody of a minor person under the age of 18 years is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00. [Ord. T6-11 § 5, 1985.]
